



Australia Awards Short Course Governing in the Digital Age – the Use of Data for Better Policies and Public Services



The participants of Governing in the Digital Age – a course exploring information management and data principles while establishing linkages with Australian institutions.

The course aimed to strengthen the capacity of government (both national and local government) in producing, analysing and using data to inform policy decisions. The course provided examples, strategies and tools that have been used by international, Indonesian and Australian agencies on the use of data, including big data for policy making and implementation.

The course enabled twenty-four Indonesian participants to share their experiences with Australian practitioners and consider the insights and perspectives of professionals from both the Australian private and public sectors while establishing linkages with Australian institutions and experts.

Leading the course was Professor Dian Tjondronegoro along with Course Co-Leader Dr Tom Verhelst and Course Designer and Co-Leader Professor Alan Liew.
