Mainstreaming Disaster Risk Management into Annual National and Sub-National Planning and Budgeting

The Mainstreaming Disaster Risk Management (DRM) into Annual National and Sub-National Planning and Budgeting short course complemented the work of DFAT's DRM program (SIAP SIAGA) aiming to improve Indonesia's ability to prevent, prepare for, respond to, and recover from rapid and slow onset disasters, and to strengthen cooperation between Australia and Indonesia on humanitarian issues in the region.

The course was delivered by Griffith University's Course Leader Mr Iain MacKenzie, *Co-Leader* Dr Febi Dwirahmadi, mentors Professor Cheryl Desha and Mr Greg Hallam and a range of specialist guests speakers, enabling cross country linkages between Australia and Indonesia through the course.

The 25 course participants came from the central government (15); local governments (8); and CSOs (2). The ministries included Bappenas; Indonesian National Board for Disaster Management (BNPB); Ministry of Finance; Ministry of Home Affairs; and Ministry of Social Affairs. The group was joined by Embassy Liaison Officer from the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade.
