The biggest and most complex issues in our lives and societies are resolved through public policy. The current pandemic poses policy challenges, but so too do our everyday activities and choices. How do we ensure that our education system provides the most appropriate education for our children; how do we make sure there is clean water for everybody; how do we help our diverse populations strive for high standards of living while preserving our environment for the future; how do we stop people dying in motor accidents?

Questions like these and many more test public policy practitioners and analysts. In this lecture, Professor Adam Graycar will explore some of the considerations that help us resolve some of these issues. The lecture will explore how to use many types of knowledge for our public policy practice – statistical, scientific, ethical, legal and community knowledge, public opinion, and knowledge of what policies are effective.

Adam Graycar is Professor of Public Policy and Director of the Stretton Institute at the University of Adelaide. He has had careers in both academia and government. He has held positions of Professor of Public Policy or Social Policy at universities in Australia, Asia and the US. While at the Australian National University, he was Director of the Research School of Social Sciences, and the founder of the Transnational Research Institute on Corruption.

Professor Graycar acquired extensive policy experience over 22 years in various senior level posts he held in both in the Federal and the South Australian Governments including Head of the Cabinet Office, Government of South Australia (2004-2007). He now teaches globally and works extensively with agencies such as the United Nations and World Bank.

He has two doctorates from the University of New South Wales, is the author of some 300 scholarly publications, and is a Fellow of the Academy of the Social Sciences in Australia.
