Overview

On paper, it looked like good public policy. The Home Insulation Program introduced in Australia in 2008 was intended to stimulate the economy during the Global Financial Crisis, provide jobs for low-skilled workers and improve the energy efficiency of thousands of homes. So why did it fail? Achieving policy success is very difficult and needs much more than good intentions and government and community support. This presentation will outline the many reasons why 'good' public policies fail. Using the case of the Home Insulation Program policy failure, the presentation will outline how the chances of policy success can be greatly increased if those designing and implementing a policy are aware of the causes of policy failure and take these into account.
